LENT is a time to repent, to turn away from sin and to turn toward the new life given in Christ Jesus. It is a time to give up whatever gets in the way of our relationship with God and to give more of ourselves as we express the love of God to neighbors.

#### **APRIL**

1 Research local and national charities that might be the recipients of your pocket change.

2 Pray: "God, let us live new life, free of sin, through Christ Jesus. Amen."

- 3 Talk with friends or family about the meaning of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.
- 4 Read 2 Corinthians 5:20-6:13. Let go of all that keeps your heart from opening wide to God.

**5** Fast today—or give up sweets. 6 Weed your neighbor's garden.

7 Go to church. Invite fellowship time with friends and family.

8 Read Romans 6:5-11. What does it mean to you to die with Christ? To be alive to God?

**9** Discuss with a loved one: How is my spirit being renewed in this season of Lent?

10 Pray the Lord's Prayer slowly, reflecting on each line. How could praying this prayer seriously and regularly change your life?

11 Journal about what it means for you to be united with Christ.

12 Fast today—or give up time you would spend on the computer or on video games.


13 Make a cross out of wood. Paint the cross or cover it with pictures.

14 PALM SUNDAY Go to church. Wave palm branches and shout, "Hosanna!"

15 Count your pocket change. Give it to the charity you have selected.

- 16 Visit someone in a hospital, nursing home, or prison.
  17 Imagine walking with Jesus. Hear him teach. See him heal. Listen to him say, "The Son of Man must suffer and die."

  18 Man Must Suffer and die."
- 18 MAUNDY THURSDAY Attend the Maundy Thursday service. Reflect on Jesus' words: "This is my body given for you; this is my blood of the new covenant.
- 19 GOOD FRIDAY Attend the Good Friday service. Spend time in silence. Light a candle. Read Mark 14:32-15:47 or Luke 22:39-23:56.
- 20 Wait. Be in silence. Pray: "Merciful God, in life and in death, we belong to you, through Jesus Christ. Amen."
- 21 EASTER DAY Celebrate! Shout, "Christ is risen!" Joyfully share these words with someone "Live the new life in Christ!"

# The 6:8 Project What's happening?



The 6:8 Project is a 501(c)(3) organization that was established by Emmanuel in 2013. The mission of the 6:8 Project is "Hand in hand, street by street" and derives its name from Micah 6:8; our purpose is to "Seek justice, love kindness, walk humbly" in Christian-based accompaniment and advocacy. The 6:8 Project currently focuses on the Greenway neighborhood of Fort Worth. The project partners with residents as well as EPC, Trinity Habitat for Humanity, the Greenway Neighborhood Association, Greenway Church, and other organizations and uses the house at 1912 Portland Ave., a Trinity Habitat for Humanity home, as a base of operations.

On Martin Luther King Day (January 21) and some follow-up days, The 6:8 Project worked with groups from Tarrant Churches Together (TCT), EPC, and student groups from TCU to work on several of the neighborhood homes that needed repair and that could not be fixed by the residents alone for health and income reasons. A big THANK YOU to all the volunteers that made a huge difference. A carport that was falling apart and rotten was reframed with new lumber. A wheelchair ramp was fixed. A fence that was falling down was rebuilt. A sink drain was sealed. Rotten exterior trim was replaced. An oven was fixed. The homeowners, several of whom were over 80 years old, thanked us from the bottom of their hearts.

What is up next for the 6:8 Project? On **March 30**, as part of the Cowtown Cleanup, residents and volunteers will meet at the 6:8 house at 8 am and pick up trash in the neighborhood. During **the summer**, the 6:8 Project will work with Tarrant Area Food Bank to provide lunches for school-age kids and will also provide enrichment activities on three days each week.
