There's no place like home for the holidays...so the beloved Christmas song goes. This Advent, we are going to be thinking about home: those who seek a home in far off places, how we find a home with God and with one another, and the God who comes in Jesus to make a home with us. The home Jesus is born into is a world of Herods and threats, of strangers and wise seekers, and of covenant calls to care for the stranger and the foreigner.

We will be considering how God's *advent* – or coming – was in a very specific way. Jesus came as a refugee, showing what some liberation theologians call God's preferential option for the poor in flesh-and-blood. The incarnation, Emmanuel, God-With-Us, is the heart of our faith. This Advent, we deepen our connection to the coming Christ child who comes home to this world, bringing with him hope, joy, love, and peace.

I have created a devotional guide for this series Coming Home: Migration and the Advent of God. You may find it in the narthex, or on our website <a href="here">here</a>. We will journey from the call to feed the stranger, orphan, and widow in Leviticus and Ruth, to blessing within and beyond borders in Ezekiel, to God's holy road in Psalm 146 and Isaiah, to the risk of home in the Matthew as Jesus is born in Bethlehem, and the family flees to Egypt to escape Herod, echoing the words of Hosea. Each Sunday's scripture reflection includes prompts such as ponder, imagine, contextualize, remember, act, and create. Whether this devotional guide is used as part of our Tuesday night and Sunday morning bible studies during Advent, or in your own personal devotional in this holy season, I pray it will be a companion to you, as we discover anew the advent of God who makes a home with us, and who shows us the meaning of home.

- Received with gratitude the 2024 Financial Review, as presented by Treasurer Rick Thompson
- Noted that several members and Whitney attended Kelly Balthrop's Celebration of Life
- Heard that the Child Care Worker search was beginning
- Was reminded that the Advent Series would be Coming Home: Migration and the Advent of God
- Learned that the Longest Night Service, a service of solace, was scheduled for Sunday, December 14th, at 4PM
- Officer Training for new and continuing officers is scheduled for Saturday, December 6th, from 9noon
- Learned that 2 members are working with Sotheby's online getting price valuations for the donated art from Wanda Asire's estate
- Reviewed a request from a woman connected to the Clubhouse to host a Special Needs Revival at Emmanuel; voted10-1 to have Frank LeCocq and Linda Greenwell continue to explore a possible partnership with the School for such an event
- Approved the updated Child, Youth, and Vulnerable Adults Protection Policy
