



Board and Committee Reports

Session:

- Learned that a confirmand will be received into membership on Palm Sunday, April 14th.
- Approved an amended 2019 budget to be presented to the congregation at the Annual Meeting.
- Learned that \$1,066 was received for the Christmas Joy Offering and \$1,125 to date for the Christmas Wish List.
- Voted to approve the 2019 Special Offerings as presented.
- Learned that Emmanuel was recertified as an Earthcare congregation.
- Voted to move the income from recycling to go directly into the Green, rather than General Fund.
- Approved collection of funds for the Souper Bowl of Caring on February 3rd, 100% of which goes to NEED.
- Elected Tonia Thompson and Sheryl Taylor to serve as commissioners to the February 23rd Stated Meeting of Grace Presbytery at Preston Hollow Presbyterian Church, Dallas
- Elected Rick Thompson to serve as Treasurer and Sheryl Taylor to serve as Clerk of Session for 2019.
- Was reminded of upcoming special dates:

Deacons:

- The Deacons thanked Leah Wyckoff and Claire Morris for their care, concern and service to the Board of Deacons and the members of the Emmanuel Presbyterian congregation as they have completed their terms.
- Newly ordained Deacons, Courtney Loy and James Taylor, were welcomed to the Board.
- While some committee assignments are still in progress, the Card Committee, Fellowship Committee and Hospitality Committee have been organized and have begun working to provide the Congregation with encouragement, care and support.

Habitat for Humanity builds affordable housing around the world for qualified families. In the past 40 years, Habitat has built more than 70,000 new homes and rehabbed or repaired another 100,000 homes through the disaster response and recovery efforts. Those future homeowners perform hundreds of hours of sweat equity, which can take many forms: building their home or a home for another family, build-site clean-up, working in a Habitat ReStore, assisting in administrative duties, or countless other ways of helping out. Children sometimes also can contribute by earning good grades in school. The local Habitat in Jackson County, Florida, awards one hour of sweat equity for every "A" that a child earns.

The 2019 Martin Luther King Day of Service



Thank you for the amazing support of the many volunteers who participated in the 2019 Martin Luther King Day of Service. A group from Emmanuel and many other faith groups started off the day at Baker Chapel AME Church for a spirit-filled and interfaith service at 9 am. Over 800 people participated in that, and then they went to various mission site locations to do service work.

One of those mission locations was The 6:8 Project in the Greenway neighborhood. Approximately 35 people came from Tarrant Churches Together (including some Emmanuel volunteers), 5 came directly from Emmanuel and 8 from the neighborhood to provide leadership. Also, about 45 students came from TCU to participate in their MLK Day activities, and they were led by members of the Alphi Phi Alphi fraternity, who have partnered with Emmanuel and The 6:8 Project on many other occasions.

At the 6:8 Project, volunteers worked on rehab tasks at 7 different houses. Volunteers organized and cleaned the 6:8 house, repaired fence, did some plumbing, repaired wheelchair ramps, replaced exterior trim, replaced rotten wood in door thresholds, and reframed a carport. After this, one woman now has a working kitchen sink and faucet after several years of dealing with a leak there. Hope was delivered in the form of hands-on work to build up the Greenway neighborhood.
