### Disrupted by Beauty

An angel (you know who you are!) who has been visiting our church fairly frequently heard of my upcoming preventative surgery and gifted me with the most incredible care package: lotion, a candle, prayer charms, an incredible note of support, and among all the other kindnesses, a copy of Cole Arthur Riley's book *Black Liturgies: Prayers, Poems, and Meditations for Staying Human*. I cannot begin to describe what a companion those words are to me on this journey of wholeness.

Cole Arthur Riley is something of the theological antidote to a Joel Osteen-style live your best life now! theology. It's not that she doesn't want us to live our best lives. It's just that she practices a faith that is not found in perfecting ourselves or performing our faith in a sort of spiritual competition to be the very best. She offers us radical realness, which is of course theologically speaking, radical incarnation. Faith that is not about perfection but about honesty. Faith that is not about disembodied pure souls but about complicated bodies struggling toward wholeness.

And it is not just my particular body on this journey, y'all. I see you on that path, too. Surgeries expected and unexpected, illnesses surprising and painfully persistent, grief fresh or very old, change that brings life and change that brings terror. As I told our elders at our April Session meeting, I see how all of you are carrying so very much, and yet you are still showing up for one another, for this church called Emmanuel, and for our community in powerful ways. We may not be living our "best" life now in the sense of perfection, but we are definitely being God's incarnate community of hope in the midst of all our church family carries in this season. This is a beautiful thing to witness. Sometimes when you are living through seasons of grief or change or illness, just getting through the day is a victory. But I find in my own spiritual life that prayerful words can be a handhold to get us through those days – something tangible and incarnational [in our bodies] and real. Words that we can cling onto for dear life because they point us to the One who never lets us go.

So, I am brought back to Cole Arthur Riley's Black Liturgies. She quotes Octavia Butler, who wrote, "The world is full of painful stories. Sometimes it seems as though there aren't any other kind, and yet I found myself thinking how beautiful that glint of water was through the trees." Riley then invites us into a prayer practice that maybe you need this day:

Inhale

Tragedy doesn't own me.

Exhale

Even here, there is beauty.

Inhale

I am more than my pain.

Exhale

My story won't be reduced.

She leaves us with a question: When was the last time beauty disrupted you?

May we find in our days journeying together toward wholeness that we are disrupted by God's beauty – beauty in water though trees, beauty in care packages of compassion, beauty in worshipping together and in serving our neighbors together. We do not have to live our "best" life to live our most beautiful life, because we find this life in God, and in our church family. Make some space to bear witness to that beauty today, and maybe bring a little of it to someone who needs to be reminded that their struggle is not all they are. They, like all of us, are beloved. Let's live our most beloved life now.

## **BOARD AND COMMITTEE HIGHLIGHTS- Session Committee Report**

Learned that a representative from the Deacons may be invited to attend the June session meeting

Was apprised of plans for preachers, pastoral care, and session moderator during Whitney's upcoming Medical Leave

Heard that Whitney will be on vacation July 25-28 (missing one Sunday)

Updates were given on those who have taken refresher course for Praesidium and it was reported that new officers were invited to take the course

Voted to elect Melissa Durkee and Jayne Johnson as commissioners to the Stated Meeting of Grace Presbytery on Saturday, May 4th, at St. Andrew Presbyterian Church, Denton

Learned that the April 27th Concert on Harwood raised \$570 contributions with QR code contributions yet to be tabulated

Voted to accept donations to offset the cost of May 11th shred day. Voted to accept electronics at shred day from members only, for a fee per item

Rejoiced at the work done in the sanctuary to relocate the organ speakers and to refresh paint in the chancel area, thanking those involved in that work

Learned that trash by the dumpster had been removed, that estimates have been secured to remove two dead tress, and that consultations will take place regarding work to be done on the steps behind SoRelle Hall

Was made aware of the Stewardship Theme for the 2024 campaign "Let Us Build a House"

Heard that Presbyterian Night Shelter lunch sacks will be assembled June 9th, following worship

Was reminded that Emmanuel is responsible for providing lunch for the Habitat build on Saturday;, May 25th

Celebrated that Whitney and Carlos have bought a home in Lewisville

Was informed by the Safety Task Force that the security camera at the front entrance has been adjusted, that defibrillator training may be offered, and that clean-up work needs to be done outside two sanctuary exits

Interested members were invited to join the Stewardship task force

Learned that the Pentecost offering will be collected on May 19th. Jazz Band will be part of worship for Pentecost as in past years

Melissa Durkee and John Stocking were thanked for their generous work at NEED; NEED service days for April are April 29th and 30th

Was informed that over \$9,000 has been raised thus far toward the Habitat build

Local Benevolence received \$640

Paperwork is being sent to Camp Gilmont in connection with Emmanuel becoming a member church, as voted by session in November of 2023

Was reminded that laying on of hands for Whitney will take place May 12th, prior to her medical leave
