*Affirmation of Faith The Confession of 1967

The life, death, resurrection, and promised coming of Jesus Christ has set the pattern for the church's mission.

His life as a human involves the church in the common life of humanity.

His service to humanity commits the church to work

for every form of human well-being.

His suffering makes the church sensitive to all the sufferings of humankind so that it sees the face of Christ in the faces of people in every kind of need. His crucifixion discloses to the church God's judgment on people's inhumanity to each other and the awful consequences of

its own complicity in injustice.

In the power of the risen Christ and the hope of his coming, the church sees the promise of God's renewal of human life in society and of God's victory over all wrong.

The church follows this pattern in the form of its life

The church follows this pattern in the form of its life and in the method of its action.

So to live and serve is to confess Christ as Lord.

The institutions of the people of God change and vary as their mission requires in different times and places. The unity of the church is compatible with a wide variety of forms, but it is hidden and distorted when variant forms are allowed to harden into sectarian divisions, exclusive denominations, and rival factions.

Jesus Christ has given the church preaching and teaching, praise and prayer, and Baptism and the Lord's Supper as means of fulfilling its service of God among people. These gifts remain, but the church is obliged to change the forms of its service in ways appropriate to different generations and cultures.
